

PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Greetings Saints!

I have been re-reading the Psalms as a part of my recently completed Lenten devotions and, while many of them are favorite pieces of scripture for me, I particularly enjoyed this section of Psalm 106..... "Praise the Lord! Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever."

I viewed a famous painting recently by French artist, Jules Breton. I am sure many of you might also have seen this beautiful work entitled The Song of the Lark. The painting depicts a peasant girl on her way to the field for a hard day of work. Suddenly, it appears, she has heard the sound of a lark. Breton captures her upturned face, alive with hope and joy, thrilled to hear the lilting beauty of the lark's sweet song. From her dress, she is obviously just another peasant girl with a difficult, workday life. But Breton captures something of her inner soul — a human being glorying in one of nature's loveliest voices, a person enriched by the beauty of God's creation.

Interestingly, the painting has no image of a bird in it. The lark that gives rise to such pleasure is unseen.

And so, it is with God. We cannot see God with our own physical eyes. Nevertheless, we can feel God's presence and hear God's words of comfort, admonition, and encouragement. We do see God moving in the circumstances of our lives. Though unseen, God adds joy, hope, meaning, and purpose to our day-to-day lives.

God is singing a song especially for YOU today. Look up and listen! Whenever I think about the changing seasons from winter to spring and then summer, I try to think again about seeing God in the unseen. I marvel in the beauty of the green buds appearing on the trees, the small springtime flowers tentatively breaking through the surface of the soil, and then finally the smell of fresh cut grass in my neighborhood.

All these signs remind me that God is always found in the small wonders of the beauty of creation. And I encourage you, in this time of changing seasons, to look again for the face of God in the beauty of the world around you. And remember that God has made all this beauty especially for your enjoyment. Be kind to God's creation and watch as new life springs forth for us all to enjoy!


