Happy Fall to the Saints!

Recently I was re-reading the great book, <u>Simple Church</u> and I came across, once again these paragraphs...

Simple is in. Complexity is out. Out of style at least.

Ironically people are hungry for simple because the world has become much more complex. The amount of information available to us is continually increasing. The ability to interact with the entire world is now possible. Technology is continuing to advance at a rapid pace.

The result is a complicated world with complex and busy lives. And, in this midst of complexity, people want to find simplicity. They long for it, they seek it, pay for it, even dream of it. Simple is in. Simple works. People respond to simple. The simple revolution has begun.

I know many reading these words can agree with these statements. Our lives have become so complex, busy, even over-planned that we are beginning to feel like mice running on treadmills. And I am concerned that we are literally at danger of "burning out" because of all this over-programming.

But we follow a Savior who stepped into his own complicated and polluted religious scene. But Jesus did not play by the rules of the world when he came, in fact, he preferred spending time with tax collectors and sinners. Into the religious community, where the leaders spent their days debating which were the appropriate divisions in society and ranking the commands for the people, Jesus comes. And Jesus brings with him the ability to take the complex and make it simple.

As a revolutionary of simple, Jesus was bothered, I think, by the meaningless and distracting clutter. And today many of our churches have become so cluttered. So cluttered that people have a difficult time encountering the simple and powerful message of Christ. So cluttered that many people have resorted to *doing* church instead of *being* the church. What about our church?

The time-period of November and December can be full of holiday opportunities to really complicate our lives... OR... it can be a time to consciously return to a simpler and more relaxed way of life. Are there holiday traditions in your family that have been set aside because now you are just too busy to accomplish them? Are there people you miss seeing at this time of year, because you just don't have the time? Are you desiring a return to traditions you have missed for the last few years?

Maybe this year, 2023 could be your chance to set aside some of the holiday complexity... in favor of a return to a simpler celebration of the holidays? Here at Immanuel, we will offer an Advent study and other activities that might be of help to you in returning to that simpler celebration at this joyous time of year.

I hope you will join us on a journey to explore a simpler holiday celebration. Not only will you see and feel the results, but you might just also learn to be a designer for other areas of your life. You just might learn to design a simpler holiday for your family and friends. We welcome you to join our journey toward simplicity!

It's that time of year again! Please support the Mission Team by buying a beautiful door spray for \$20.00.


